"Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:16, NIV)





- Eggs are dyed to represent the blood of Jesus Christ. In Orthodox and Eastern Catholic Churches, eggs are dyed red to represent the blood of Jesus, before being blessed and distributed to congregants. Now they're mostly just a fun way to celebrate the springtime season, especially with creative decorating ideas.
- Easter is the oldest among Christian holidays.
- Easter customs vary around the world, but one tradition comes from Germany that of the Easter bunny. First recognized sometime in the 17th century, the Easter bunny is known for bringing eggs to the local children. In other countries, such as Bermuda, children fly kites, to represent Jesus' resurrection and ascension to heaven. Other countries, such as Australia and the United Kingdom have Easter bonnet parades, where children can decorate their own bonnets, and show them off in a parade, as Easter was traditionally a time to wear new clothes. One extra-special Easter Monday custom is that residents of Haux, France, join together to whip up a gigantic omelet for everyone to enjoy using more than 4000 (yes, 4000!) eggs! Yum!
- The date of Easter changes every year. You may have noticed, unlike Christmas or Halloween, Easter does not have a fixed date. It is a moveable holiday due to Passover, which is influenced by the moon's cycle each year.
